



## FROM THE RECTOR

My dear Brothers and Sisters:

I would like to share with you the following meditation:

### *Calmed by the Presence of Christ*

Some months ago I began to feel the presence of God less than before. At first I thought of various things, fearing that they were the reason why the Lord had withdrawn from me, [but] the Lord made me realize that I should concentrate on loving him and believing in his love. And I believe that love has continued to guide me, though less sensibly, and to make me understand many other things.

I said that I experience the presence of God less, but it would be better to say that I now experience it in another way. Formerly, I experienced and enjoyed the tenderness of the divine arms carrying me; but now, without ceasing to believe that he still carries me, I experience the holiness of God and my own nothingness. My whole prayer is to ask mercy, grace, and pardon. Many times I meditate on the *Miserere* (Ps 51), when the Lord lets me do so, but at other times I do nothing but remain quiet in my nothingness, and silence is my supplication. If at times I fear I may not have done what I ought or have displeased the Lord somehow by working against the Spirit, I realize at once that such is not the case. They were faults and imperfections that did not penetrate to the depths of my soul; the mercy of God consumes them and I do not lose my peace and quiet.

There are moments when it seems that a great torrent of water is confined in my heart and it wants to gush forth with great force. Then I don't know what to do; I feel foolish and can only say: "O Jesus, give me love." I go to Mary and say to her: "My mother, teach me how to love Jesus. Give me the love of your heart. In order to love him as much as you loved him and still love him. My Mother, give me love, for I suffer greatly."

Sometimes in recreation the nuns ask me about spiritual things. I only know that in loving God one is blessed and lacks nothing and understands everything, although one may not know how to express it.

## Kip Hardgrave Speaking this weekend: June 19-20, 2021

**Kip Hardgrave** graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 1967 before joining the US Marine Corps and was injured in Vietnam. Back in the States, Kip entered Maryknoll as a seminarian and studied for 4 years then went on to serve as a Maryknoll missionary in El Salvador before leaving the seminarian to marry. In 1983, Kip with his wife and son reentered Maryknoll Lay Missioners and served for 3 years in Bolivia. Upon his return to the US, Kip coordinated the refugee resettlement effort at Catholic Charities for 20 years before going into retirement. Even in retirement, Kip still helps two parishes maintain a relationship with a small town in Nicaragua.

**Kip** will speak at all Masses here at the Cathedral the weekend of **June 19-20, 2021** to share his mission experience as part of the Diocese of Providence's Missionary Cooperation Plan 2021.
